

ACCESS & CHECK-IN

- When you arrive at the York Street site, enter through the Bonfils-Stanton Visitor Center (1007 York St., Denver, CO, 80206) for check-in and then meet the tour guide in the lobby of the Boettcher Memorial Center.
- Bring your booking confirmation (either on your phone or a printed copy) with you to speed up the check-in process.
- Check-in for tours begins 15 minutes before the scheduled tour time and ends 5 minutes after the tour start time.

CANCELLATION & REFUND POLICY

- Cancellations more than one business week prior to a tour are subject to a 15% cancellation fee.
 Cancellations less than one business week prior to a tour are non-refundable.

- Unless otherwise specified, tours are approximately 60 minutes.

- Be prepared to walk and stand.

LOCATION, DIRECTIONS & TRANSPORTATION

Denver Botanic Gardens is located five minutes east of downtown Denver and is accessible by major RTD bus routes. From north or south Denver, take route #24 (York and Josephine Streets). From east or west Denver, take #10 (12th Avenue).

- Free parking is available in the parking structure located between York Street and Josephine Street, just east of the Gardens' main entrance.
- Buses should stop in the cutout on the west (right) side of York Street to unload passengers.
- Bike parking is available just south of the Bonfils-Stanton Visitor Center.
