

DENVER BOTANIC GARDENS

As we approach the 2024 Denver Botanic Gardens' Summer Concert Series and event season, our goal is to make things as smooth as possible for everyone, especially our neighbors. We have made special arrangements to restrict street parking for our neighbors during the concerts.

In June, neighborhood street parking signs will be updated with the Summer Concert Series dates. Please note that the City & County of Denver issues Residential Parking Permits for a fee and welcomes online applications or renewals. Permits are required in posted areas and verification is now based on the license plate and vehicle information on file with the City's permitting system.

Right of Way Enforcement staff will reference vehicle license plates to verify permitted vehicles. Any vehicle without a current permit may be ticketed and/or towed.

A Residential Parking Permit must be renewed annually and exempts a vehicle from the posted, on-street parking restrictions on the block where the permit is issued. A permit does not guarantee a parking space and is not valid in any other area of Denver.

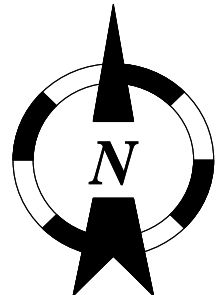
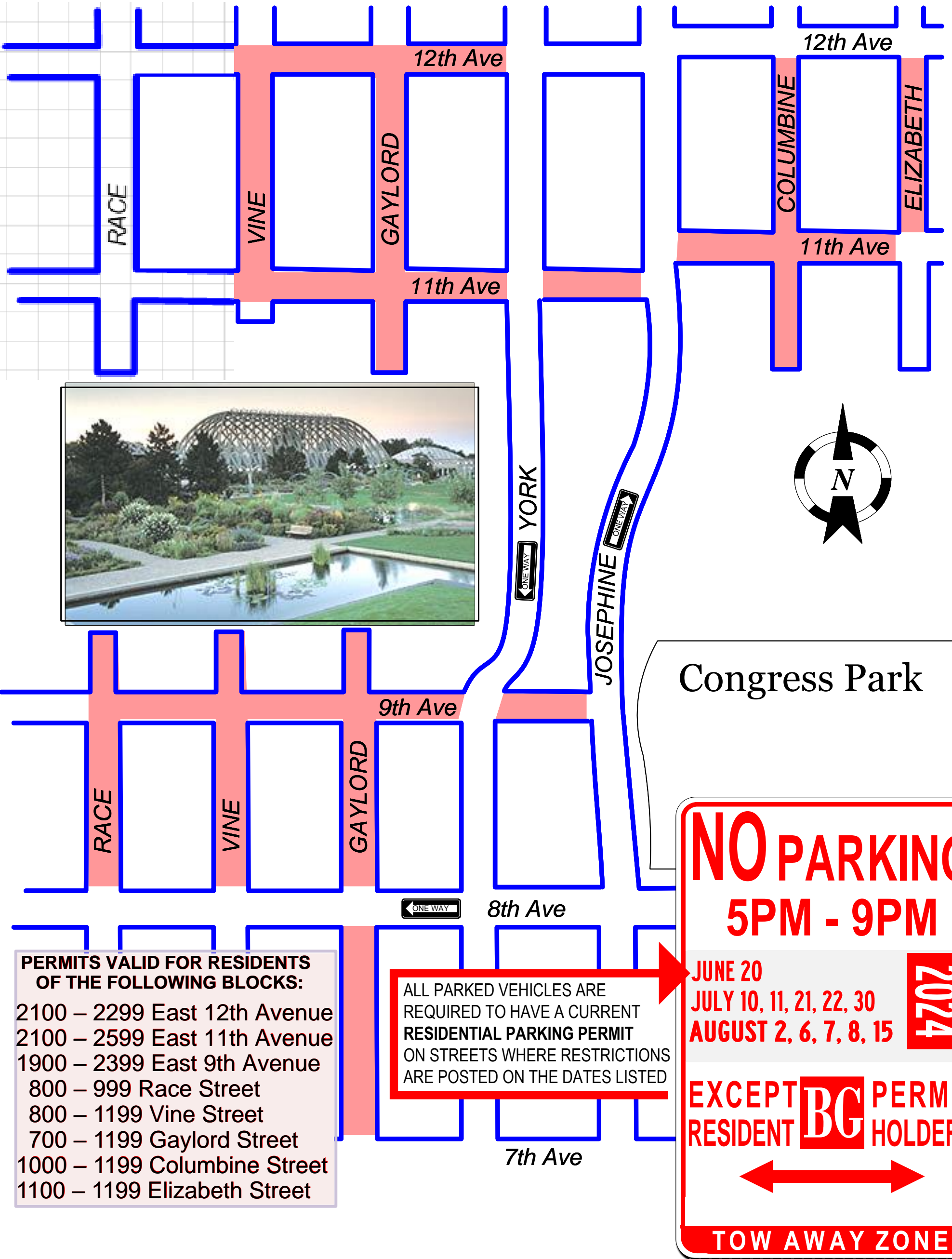
Residential Parking Permits also do not allow parking in violation of any other parking regulation such as loading zones, street sweeping, "No Parking" zones, parking more than 72-hours in one spot, or any other posted or non-posted parking restriction.

Current permit holder renewal notices are mailed in April and can be renewed online. We encourage neighbors to apply or renew soon to be ready before the first concert in June. For more information, visit denvergov.org/parking.
